

Natalie Creek Flood Control Groundbreaking

149th St. and Kilpatrick, Midlothian, IL / Monday, November 19, 2018 at 3:00 p.m.



The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District
of Greater Chicago, the Village of Midlothian and the City of
Oak Forest will mark the beginning of construction on the
Natalie Creek flood control project.

This project will address overbank flooding by upsizing restrictive culverts, widening the channel at several locations, and creating a new storm-water storage basin along Natalie creek. The project will increase the level of protection to existing residential and commercial structures that are prone to flooding in frequent storm events. During a 100-year storm event, the improvements will provide flood reduction benefits for 237 structures from 157th & Central Park in Oak Forest to 146th & Pulaski in Midlothian.
