VILLAGE ORDINANCES

The Midlothian Police Department brings several ordinances to your attention:

1. Noise: there are a variety of ordinances intended to keep the neighborhoods peaceful.
2. Curfew is 10:30 PM Sunday through Thursday nights and 11:30 PM Friday and Saturday nights for persons under the age of 17.
3. No *open* burning of any kind is permitted, including burning of leaves.
4. No person shall stand or park any truck, tractor, semi-trailer, trailer, or bus on any residential street except for loading and unloading.
5. Dogs & cats are to be licensed. Licenses for the current year go on sale May 1 and are issued upon presentation of a certificate of rabies inoculation. The fee is \$6 per animal (\$3 for senior citizen pet owners).
6. The Village of Midlothian is "Smoke-Free" with no smoking permitted within 15' of any public place or place of employment.
7. No parking on any village street at any time if snowfall exceeds 2 inches in depth, until snow removal is completed.
8. Nuisance: there are a variety of ordinances prohibiting such things as keeping inoperable motor vehicles on private property and allowing vegetation to grow over 8 inches in length.
9. A \$5 permit is required for garage/yard sales. These may be held twice a year for up to 3 consecutive days. Signs must be removed following the sale. The annual Village-wide garage sale day does not count as your one permitted sale.
10. Building permits protect the residents of Midlothian: first, they protect the homeowner from unscrupulous workmen; second, they keep property values up by ensuring that work is done in accordance with codes. Building permits are required for all new buildings, remodeling, additions, fences, swimming pools, re-roofs, air conditioning installation. If in doubt, check with the Building Department (708)-385-8642. This will guarantee that any workmen you hire are licensed with the village and bonded.

ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT

Demystifying your water bill...

Midlothian water bills are quarterly.

Quarterly: If you receive your water bill in January it will reflect usage from the first week of September through the first week of December.

Payment is due 21 days after your bill is issued. The **next day**, a penalty is applied to the remaining balance. If you cannot pay your bill in full, any payment you make to reduce the balance will reduce your penalty.

A **\$100** water deposit is required for all single-family residences.

A **\$100** water deposit is required for each business property, for each business unit involved.

A **\$75** water deposit is required for multiple dwellings, for each

Can't get here during normal business hours? Place your payment in an envelope and drop it in our Lock Box. The Lock Box is located on the South side of the Village Hall building at the end of the ramp.

We know some of you have questions about your water bill or to put it another way, the Village of Midlothian wants you to understand what you are paying for in your bill. Your water bill is comprised of five facets including the sewer charge, the garbage charge, the administrative fee, the infrastructure charge, and the water usage charge. Below are the explanations on your water bill and what each service signifies.

The Sewer charge:

The sewer charge is based on the gallons of water you use. The water you use goes through our sewer system which has to be maintained.

The Garbage charge:

Garbage is for your residential service and the charge is exactly the same as Republic Waste charges us.

The Administrative fee:

The administrative fee is used to pay for billing, accounting, collections, and other office tasks we need to perform for sewer and water. The fee is 3.5% of the sewer, water and garbage charge.

The Infrastructure charge:

The infrastructure funds are used to pay off a bond that was issued in 2010. Most of the bond money was used to rejuvenate our water system. This bond will be paid off in 2034.

The Water Usage charge:

The water usage charge funds the purchase of water directly from Chicago and the operation of our water system.



Animals and the Village of Midlothian

Ground feeding is **not allowed** in the Village of Midlothian:

- Ground feeding of animals such as birds, cats, squirrels, chipmunks, rats, mice, rabbits, possums, skunks, deer, ducks, or any other wild animals is prohibited.
- Ground feeding is defined as the spreading, casting, laying, depositing, or dumping of feed, including, but not limited to, birdseed, corn, bread pieces, food scraps, or any like or similar substance, on any public or private property in the village. Above-ground hanging bird feeders are allowed as long as all feed is placed in a container or feeder designed for the specific purpose of feeding birds.
- The prohibition of ground feeding is to prevent rodent infestation, disease from feces, and a public nuisance from droppings.

Licensing of animals:

- All dogs and cats over 4 months old must be licensed by the Village.
- The cost is \$6 per animal per year (\$3 for seniors).
- All dogs and cats must be inoculated every 12 months or have a 3-year inoculation for rabies.
- Each household is allowed to have a maximum combination of 3 dogs and/or cats. The litter of puppies or kittens is excluded as long as they have not reached 4 months of age.

Be a Responsible Pet Owner:

- Owning a pet is a rewarding experience; however, it can be a nightmare for your neighbors if you do not take that pet ownership seriously and care for your animal(s).
- Dogs and cats are not allowed to run at large. Animals must be leashed at all times unless in a fenced-in yard.
- All waste deposited by your dog or cat on property other than your own must be picked up and disposed of in a sanitary manner immediately.
- All waste deposited on your own property must be removed within 24 hours.
- Animals must not disturb the peace with loud noises at any time of the day or night including, but not limited to, continued and repeated howling, barking, and whining.
- Please be mindful of your animal's needs. All animals must have food, water, and appropriate veterinary care.
- Animals cannot be left unattended in a motor vehicle or enclosed trailer when the outside temperature exceeds 86° Fahrenheit. Your pet should never be exposed to extreme weather elements.

As with all sections of the village code, we prefer compliance to issuing citations. All we ask is that you be a good neighbor and a responsible pet owner. Your pet will be happier too.

Garbage Company Servicing Village of Midlothian



Your garbage pickup date only changes when the holiday falls on a Monday or Tuesday. Republic Services uses a holiday schedule for only 6 holidays per year as follows:

- New Year's Day
- Memorial Day
- Fourth of July
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving
- Christmas

1. Midlothian's scheduled pick-up day is Tuesday. Toters may be placed at the curb no earlier than 9 am on Monday and must be brought in no later than 9AM Mon Wednesday. Garbage trucks are contracted to be in town between the hours of 6:30 AM and 7:00 PM on pick-up days. Trash will be collected on a weekly basis.
2. For garbage, every household must use the 96-gallon toters provided by Republic Services. To request a garbage, recycling, or yard waste-toter please contact Republic Services at **708-385-8252**.
3. All recycling, such as paper, plastic, aluminum, and glass, can be combined into your recycling toter. This toter will be emptied every other week. See the enclosed calendar for your scheduled pick-up.
4. Yard waste pick-up begins the first Tuesday in April and ends on the last Tuesday of November. Yard waste **cannot** be put into plastic bags. Yard waste must be placed in a waste-toter paper lawn bag or a 36-gallon (or smaller) container affixed with a yard waste sticker.

Large Item Pick-up

Republic Services will pick up **1 (one)** large item per household per week. This includes furniture such as couches, chairs, recliners, etc. Note: If items have any metal parts or framing, they will need to be removed before placing them at the curb.

The Village offers free branch pickup twice per year. This service is intended for fallen branches and light tree trimming. The schedule is as follows:


Northeast Quadrant First Monday in April and October



In the Midlothian Meadows Forest Preserve, which stretches from 152nd Street to 159th Street and Pulaski Road, there is a 3.1-mile biking/hiking trail through the woodlands, which connects by a footpath to other trails in the Tinley Creek Division of the Cook County Forest Preserve District. The Midlothian Meadows trail is accessible at 152nd Street on the west side of Pulaski Road and on Pulaski Road at 149th Street, via a spur trail to the main trail.
