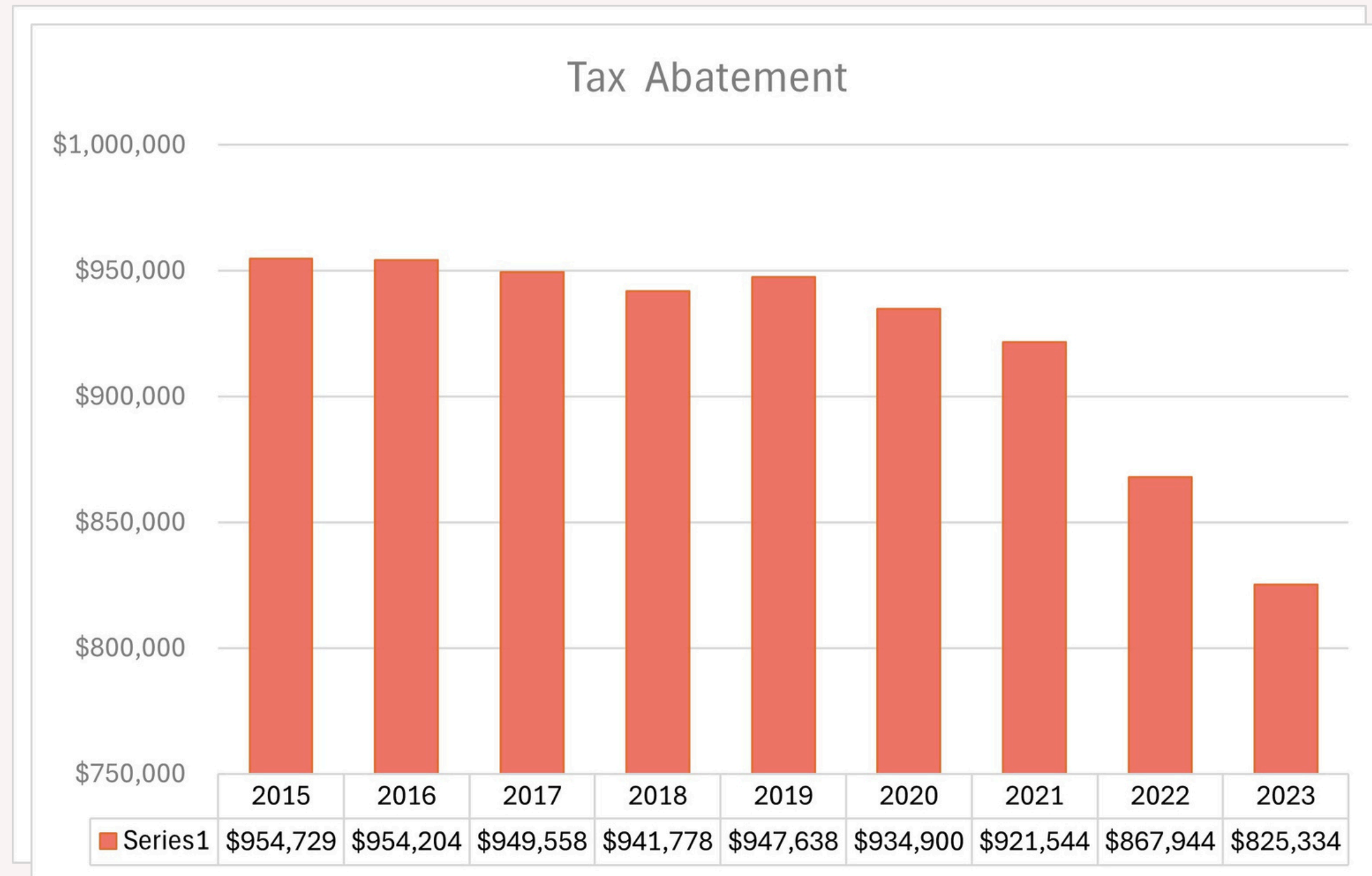

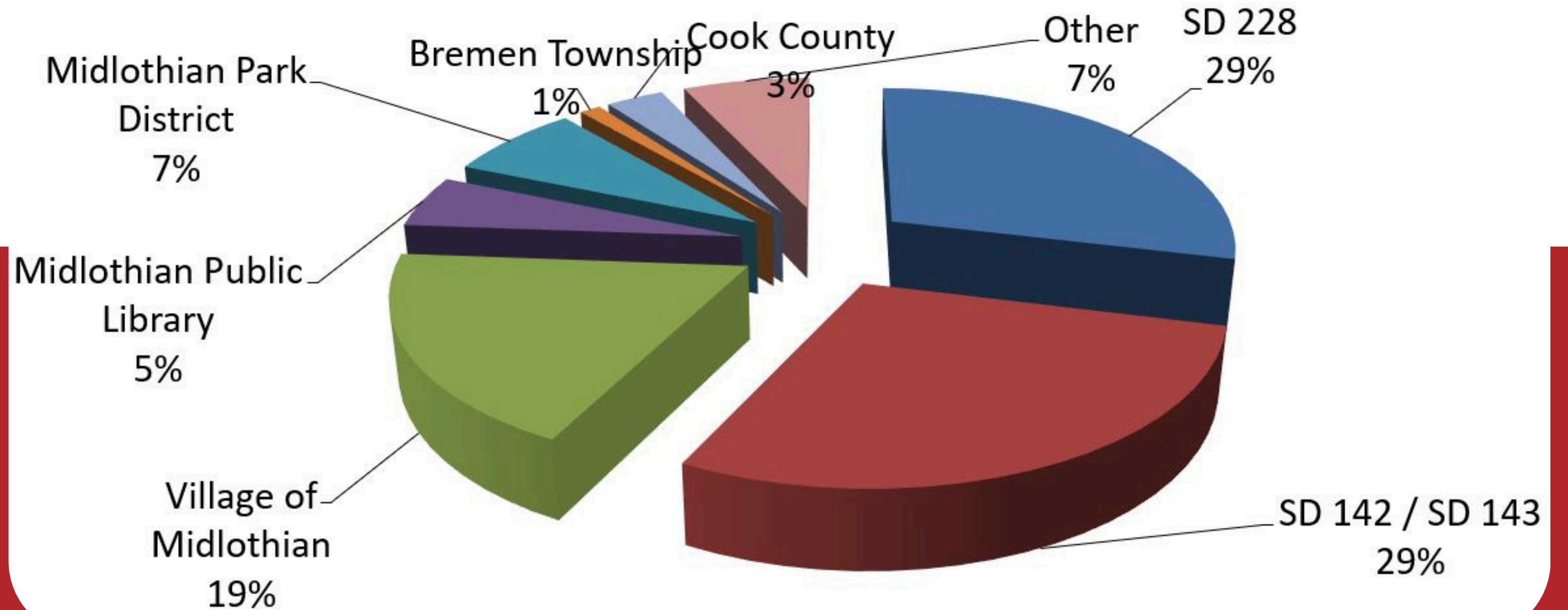

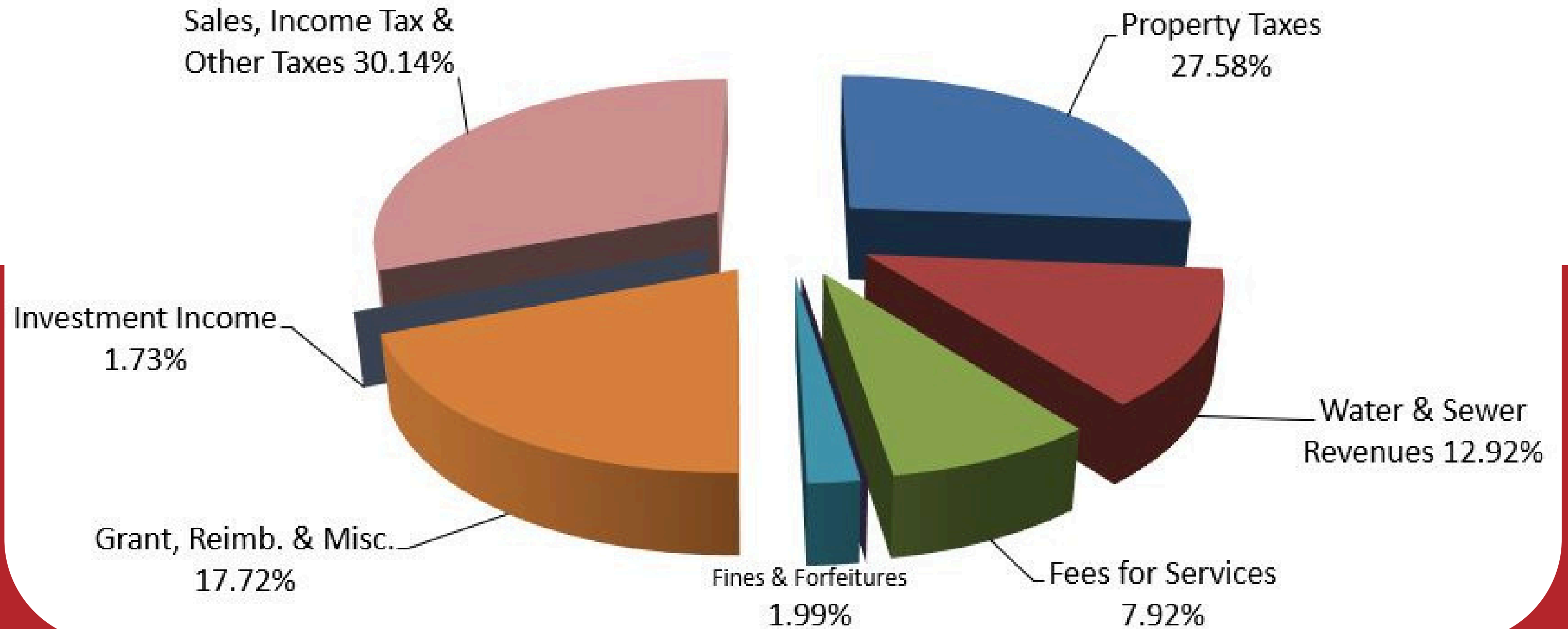

WHERE DO YOUR PROPERTY TAXES GO?



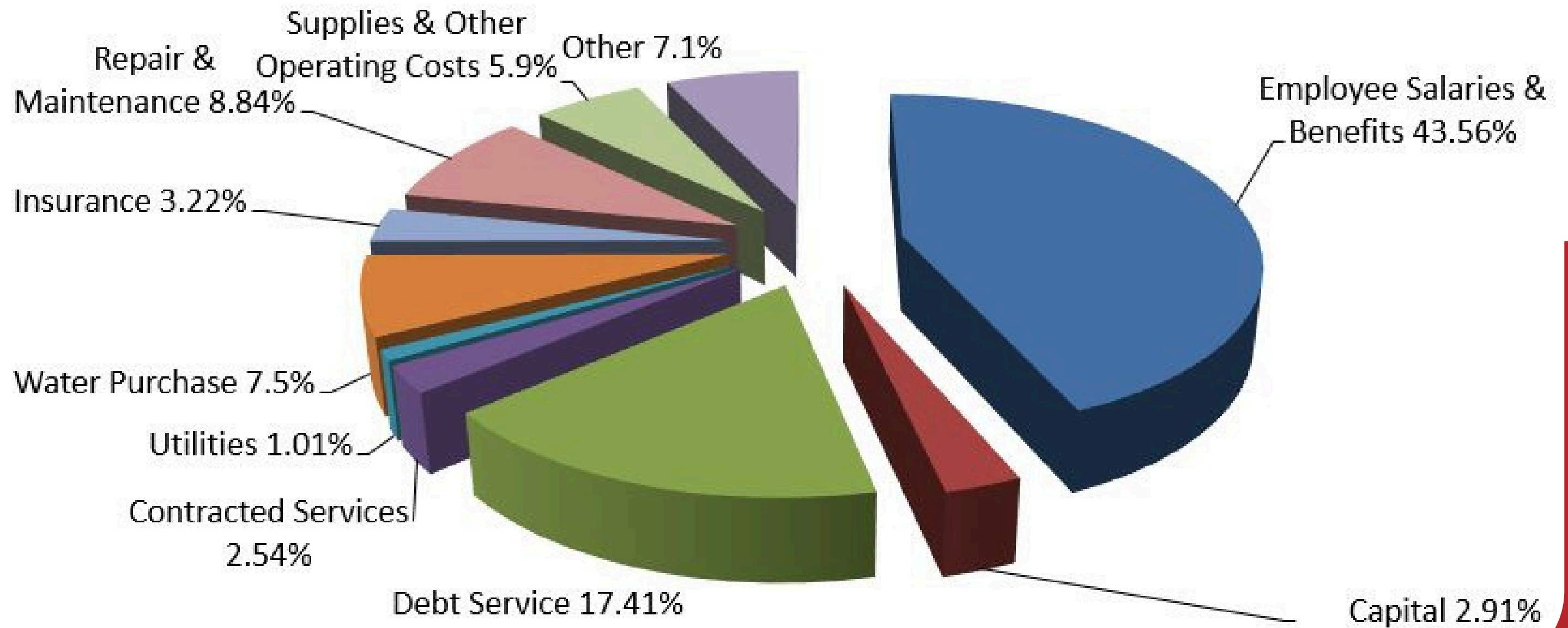
FISCAL YEAR 2023 BUDGET

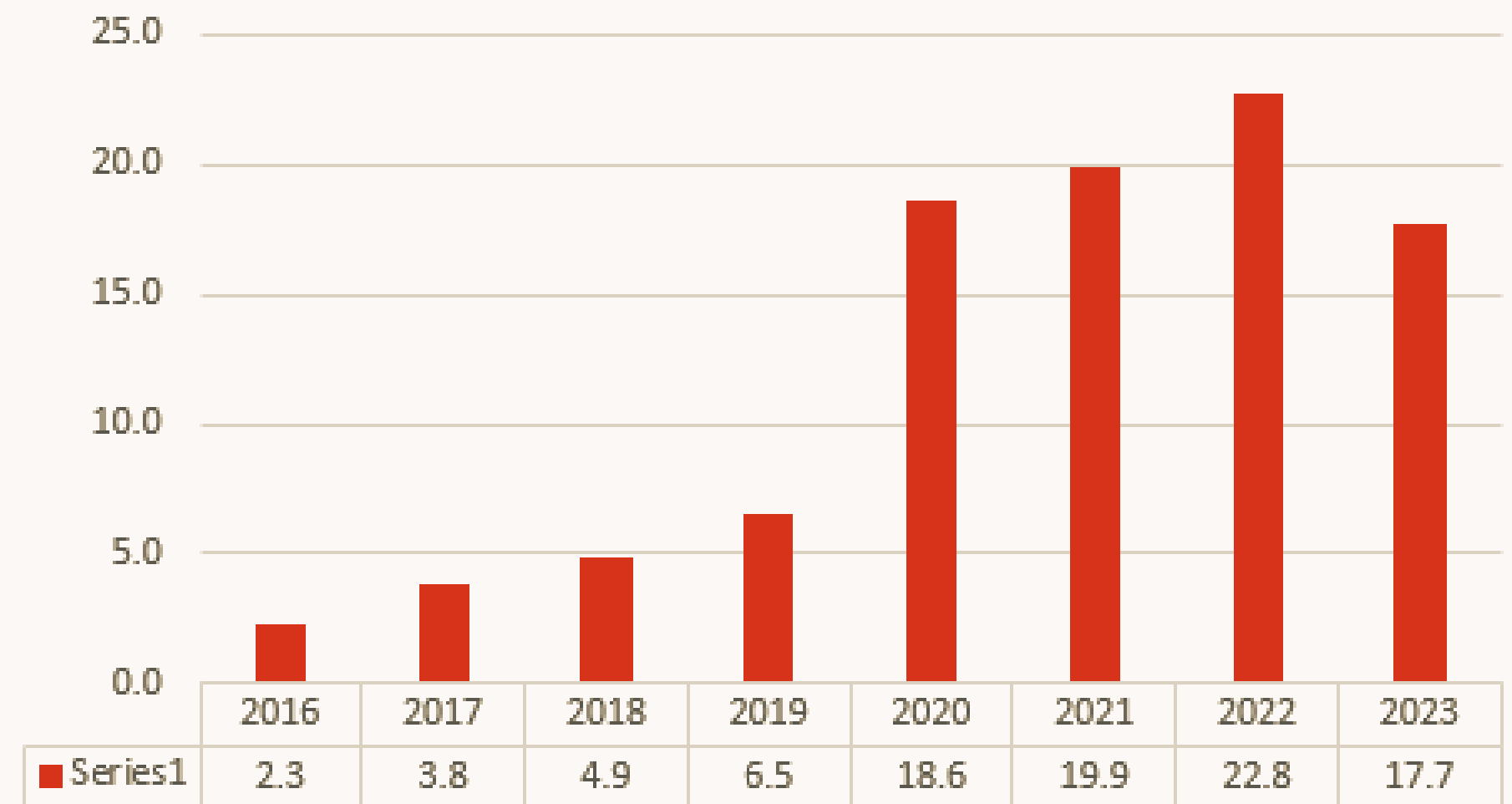


What is fund balance?

MIDLOTHIAN FUND BALANCE IN \$ MILLIONS

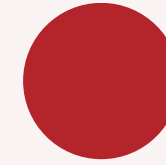

ADMINISTRATION COST SAVINGS

In 2022, the Administration Department invested in a new folding and postage machine from Quadient to handle significant mailings and enhance efficiency. This initiative resulted in cost savings for the Village in the following ways:

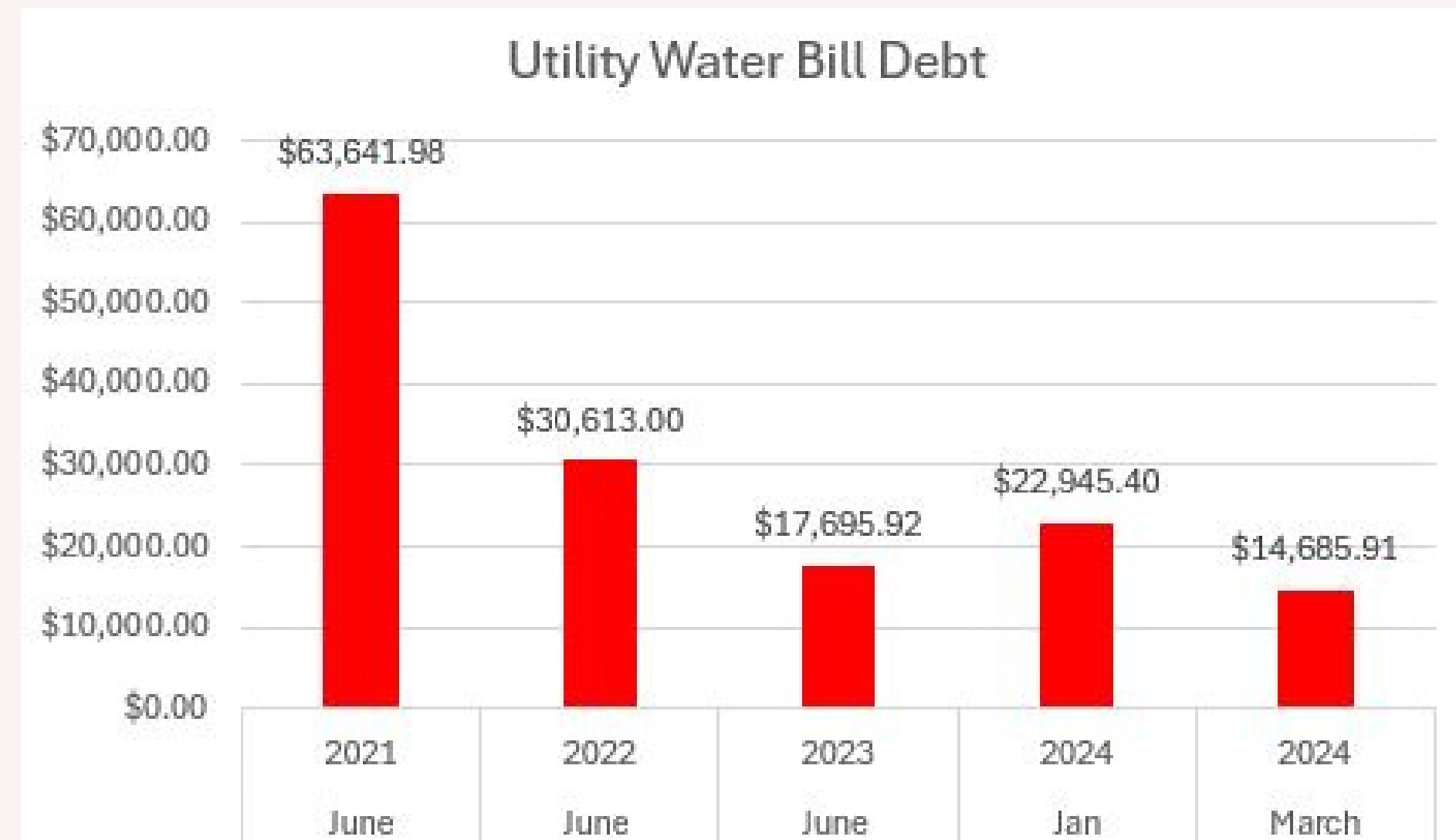
- Utility Water Billing is now processed at Village Hall starting from 2023.**

CURRENT AND FUTURE CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS



Road Resurfacing Projects– The Village will be doing \$1.5 million in road resurfacing this summer/fall. This includes a joint project with the Village of Crestwood to resurface 143rd Street from Pulaski Rd to Cicero Ave.

A list of the other streets will be published after the project has been bid out.

Sanitary Sewer Manhole Rehabilitations– The Village will be hiring a contractor to do some mandated rehabilitation work to various manholes in the Southwest quadrant of town, Pulaski to Kostner and 147th St. to Waverly Ave. This project will start in the summer/fall of 2024.

Lead Service Line Replacement – The Village has received \$2.755 million in funding from IEPA to replace lead water service lines. Phase 1 of lead service line replacement will use all this funding to replace as many service lines as possible. This project will start in the summer/fall of 2024. The Village is expected to secure more funding each year that will help with the cost to replace all lead service lines over a few years.

CURRENT AND FUTURE WORK PROJECTS



148th to 149th & Pulaski Rd Water Main Replacement Project–The Village was successful in obtaining over \$1 million in funding to replace a section of 8” water main that runs under the Metra tracks and Midlothian creek. The Village is currently working on selecting an engineering firm for this project. There currently is no estimated timeframe for the construction of this project due to the complexity of the permitting needed to work on a county road, under Midlothian Creek and under the Metra rail lines.

LED Streetlight Project–The Village is planning to replace all Village streetlight heads with LED fixtures this coming year. This will result in significant savings in power costs.

Jolly Homes Flood Mitigation Project– The Village was awarded approximately \$550,000.00 in Grant funding from Cook County for design engineering of a flood mitigation project in the Jolly Homes area. This is the area between 150th St-153rd Pl from Pulaski Rd to Central Park Ave. The design engineering is completed along with the cleaning of the existing storm sewer mains and manholes. We are in the process of applying for 2 other grants to fund the construction of this project.

CURRENT AND FUTURE WORK PROJECTS



Trib C flood mitigation project–The village is working with MWRD, The Village of Crestwood and the Bremen Township Highway department on a flood mitigation project around Maple Lane and the Midlothian Country Club which is between Central Ave. and Lavergne Ave. and 145th St. to the Midlothian Turnpike/143rd St. Construction of this project is estimated to start in late 2024 or early 2025.

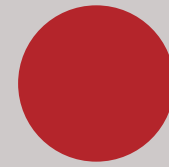
Belly Button Hill Flood Mitigation Project–The Village was awarded \$300.000 from the Cook County Highway Department to fund design engineering for a flood mitigation project in the Belly Button Hill area. This is the area south of 149th St., East of Kenton Ave. and West of Keeler Ave. that drains to the Midlothian Creek. The Village is currently working on selecting an engineering firm for this project and hopes to have the plans completed sometime in 2025.

Access to transit grant–The purpose of this project is to install a new multipurpose path south of 147th St. along METRA Right of Way to the eastern parkway of the intersection of 149th St. and Pulaski Rd., with sections of permeable pavers within the Village’s Rain Ready Community Garden. Additional improvements will include the construction of an ADA-compliant switchback ramp adjacent to the south METRA parking lot and the restriping of certain parking stalls to accommodate additional ADA-compliant spaces. Additional work will include fencing and decorative lighting

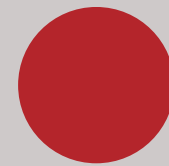

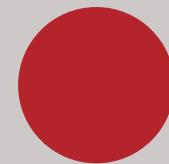

ACCOMPLISHMENTS



- **MIDLOTHIAN Paramedics achieved three life-saving interventions, successfully resuscitating an individual who was clinically dead upon arrival.**
- **The Black Shift successfully rescued an elderly lady from a fire in her bedroom, earning recognition for both the team and individuals involved.**
- **The Red Shift accomplished a technical rescue save.**
- **Progress was made towards finalizing specifications for a new Engine to replace the aging 1994 Pierce Squirt (30 years old).**
- **The Fire Department took on the role of general contractors for the much-needed repairs and updates at Station 1, including the office area and bunkroom, ensuring compliance for female firefighters.**
- **Training opportunities were established with local apartment buildings, businesses, and new construction projects in town.**

LIFE SAVING AWARD

On September 7, 2023, Engine Company 2753 and Ambulance 2732 swiftly responded to a structure fire where a person was trapped inside. Upon arrival, the crew encountered heavy smoke throughout the building. They courageously conducted an aggressive interior attack and carried out a search and rescue mission. The crew successfully located a victim trapped in the bathroom and rescued them. The victim received immediate treatment on-site and was later transported to a nearby hospital due to smoke inhalation. The crew's actions in this incident truly embody the highest standards of the Midlothian Fire Department, showcasing their dedication to serving the residents of Midlothian.



CIVILIAN LIFE SAVING AWARD

The Civilian Life Saving Award was awarded to Owen Ostott in recognition of his extraordinary act of bravery and selflessness in the face of danger on September 7, 2023. Owen demonstrated quick thinking and resourcefulness by using a hose to contain a fire at a neighbor's house. His courageous actions saved the neighbor's life and prevented further fire from spreading. Because of that, firefighters were able to make entry and make a rescue. Owen's unwavering commitment to the safety and well-being of others serves as a shining example of heroism. We extend our deepest appreciation for his remarkable bravery and selflessness.



UNIT CITATION AWARD

Red shift responded to an emergency call for a person who had fallen. The EMS team found the individual unconscious at the bottom of a 15-foot deep trench box. They called for help with a trench rescue operation and provided spinal immobilization using a backboard and C-collar. Meanwhile, the fire crew devised a rescue plan using two 24-foot ladders, a stokes basket, and safety lines to carefully extract the patient from the trench. They successfully lifted the patient by moving the basket up the ladder. This challenging incident with a positive outcome highlighted the effectiveness of the crew's response and training, allowing the patient to be discharged from the hospital after a few days.

Project Fire Buddies brings joy to kids struggling with critical illnesses. We believe that no child should fight these battles alone.

Our chapters focus on building relationships with their fire buddies. Members of PFB visit Fire Buddies in their homes, often arriving in a parade of fire vehicles with lights blazing and sirens blaring. They bring gifts for birthdays and holidays, play games, provide tickets to concerts and special events, and attend important events in the children's lives. Fire Buddies even visit the firehouse on occasion for dinner with the crew, for tours of the station and to see the rigs.

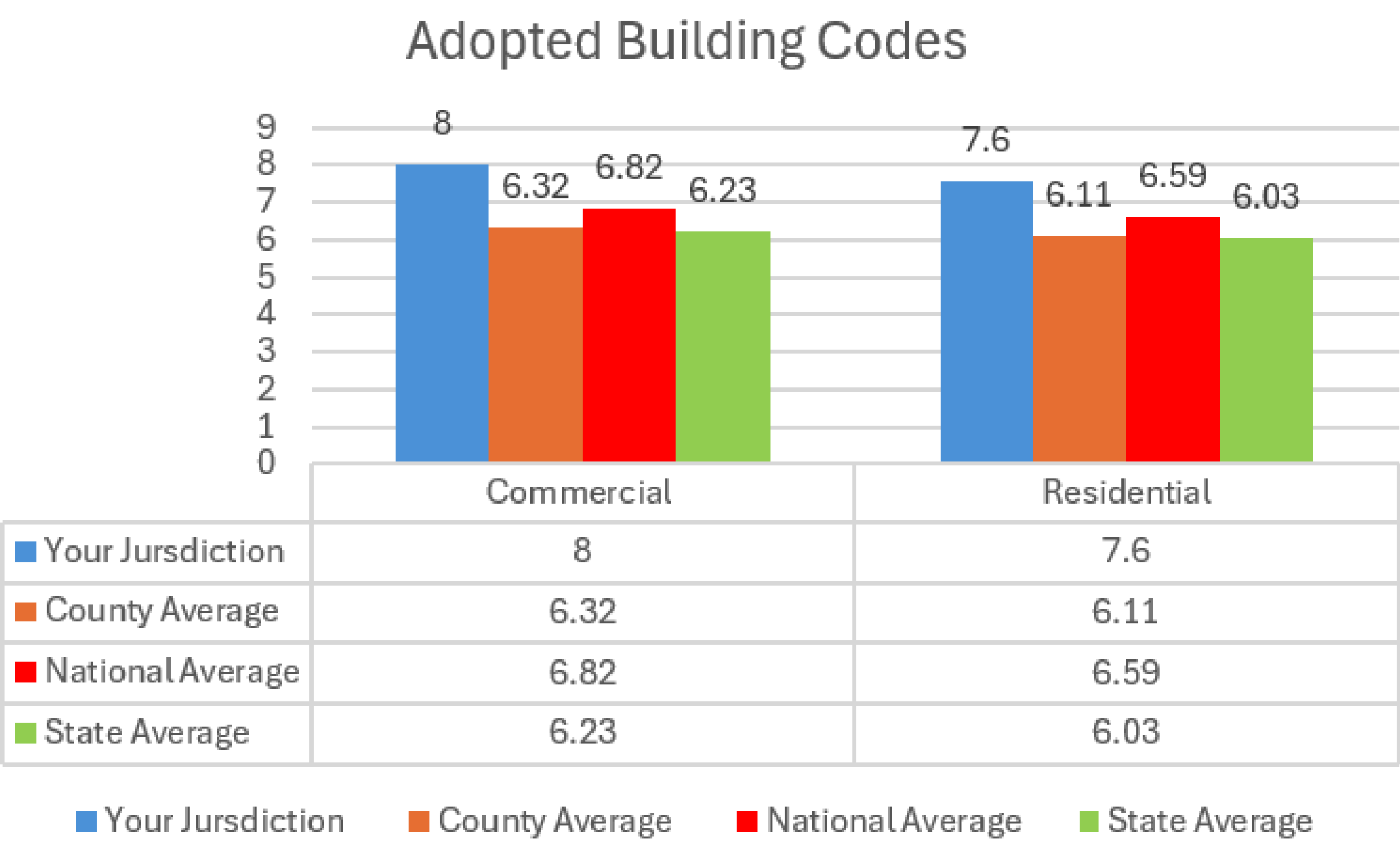

The Village has aligned its residential and commercial codes with the current code cycle. While many municipalities typically skip a cycle and update codes every 6 years. The next opportunity for adoption will be in 2024–2025 during the upcoming code cycle.

COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM

The Village completed its 5 year review of its CRS program in 2023. Since joining CRS in 2018, the Village earned enough additional points to improve its classification to a CRS 6 community. All property owners who are in the Special Flood Hazard Area and carry FEMA flood insurance are entitled to a 20% discount on their FEMA Flood Insurance premium. The improved classification is due to the efforts of the Building Department's continued implementation and enforcement of Village Building Codes and ordinances, and Public Works' stormwater management policies.

RAIN READY UPDATES



NATALIE CREEK



In the last two years, our area has experienced several significant storms, but we are pleased to announce that the improvements made to Natalie Creek are proving effective. The Village has not received any reports of major flooding or property damage.

After the residents directly affected by Natalie Creek expressed interest in the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District's (MWRD) upcoming project, which involves conducting elevation studies to request a flood map revision from FEMA to exclude homes from the floodplain, the MWRD clarified that the Natalie Creek project was designed to mitigate flooding for a 25-year storm event. While FEMA's flood insurance maps are based on more extreme storm events, the improvements at Natalie Creek were not intended to remove properties from the FEMA floodplain. Consequently, a map revision is not currently necessary. The Village was disappointed by this update and is now actively seeking grant funding to support residents in obtaining elevation certificates for submission to FEMA.

MWRD BUYOUT



In December 2023, the Village purchased the property located at 14701 Kolmar Ave (former State Farm office), as part of MWRD's flood-prone property buyout program. MWRD reimbursed the Village for the purchase price of the property, and the Village is responsible for the demolition of the building and converting the property into green space. This project will be a positive addition to Midlothian's stormwater management program.

GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE MANAGEMENT



The Village will continue its partnership with OAI, for the maintenance and management of the Village's green infrastructure locations which include: the Prairie Garden at the Rain Ready Community Garden, the Kilpatrick easement along Natalie Creek, and the Natalie Creek Culverts at Kostner, Keeler and Karlov. The Kolmar Ave property will be added in the future.
