**ORDINANCE NO. 2166**

**AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 11 OF TITLE 10  
OF THE VILLAGE OF MIDLOTHIAN MUNICIPAL CODE REQUIRING A LOCAL  
VEHICLE LICENSE IN THE VILLAGE OF MIDLOTHIAN**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Midlothian is a home rule unit pursuant to subsection (a) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, the Village of Midlothian may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, the local Vehicle License requirement of the Village of Midlothian was created several decades ago to generate revenue for street maintenance and identify Midlothian residents for law enforcement purposes and parking enforcement; and

**WHEREAS**, modern police technological advancements including police vehicles equipped with computers have made the use of a stickers applied to windshields obsolete in identifying Village residents and vehicle registration licensing data; and

**WHEREAS**, the costs in implementing and enforcement of the local Vehicle License requirement of Chapter 11, Title 10 is an inefficient means of funding street maintenance; and

**WHEREAS**, non-complaint scofflaws escape their share of the burden paid by law abiding residents with lost revenue resulting from uncollectable fines or collection agency deductions; and

**WHEREAS**, it has become apparent that the cost of implementing and enforcing the local Village vehicle license requirement and fee under Chapter 11, Title 10 of the Village Code is not a cost-effective means to fund improvements of Village streets and should be repealed and replaced with a means less cumbersome, more convenient that also reduces the overall cost and time of Village residents.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Midlothian, Illinois as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance as if restated in this Section.

**SECTION 2:** That Chapter 11, of Title 10 the Village Code is hereby repealed in its entirety.

**SECTION 3:** The invalidity of any provision of this ordinance shall not render invalid any other provision herein. If for any reason, any provision of this ordinance is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, that provision shall be deemed severed and this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 4:** All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 5:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
